# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at **Salt Lake City, Utah,** accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that **the Tintic Paymaster Mines Company**

has entered and paid for the **Silver Bell, G.N.C., Mohawk, and Promised Land lode mining claims,**

designated by the Surveyor General as **Survey No. 6597, embracing a portion of Sections twenty-one, twenty-two, and twenty-eight in Township nine south of Range two west of the Salt Lake Meridian, in the North Tintic Mining District, Utah County, Utah,**

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning **for the description of the Silver Bell lode claim, at corner No. 1, a pine post four inches square, two feet above ground, marked 1 - 1 - 6494 - B S - S, and 1 - 1 - 6597 - S B - G N C, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corners Nos. 1 of the B. S., and Sammon lode claims, Survey No. 6494, from which the northeast corner to Section twenty-eight in Township nine south of Range two west of the Salt Lake Meridian, bears north twenty-four degrees nineteen minutes east six hundred seven and five-tenths feet distant;**

**Thence, first course, north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west three hundred and eight-tenths feet to a point from which discovery bears north twenty-two degrees fifteen minutes east one hundred forty-eight and five-tenths feet distant; three hundred five feet to corner**

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No. 2, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 2-4-2-6597-S B - G N C - M, in mound of stones and earth;

Thence, second course, north eleven degrees fifteen minutes east one thousand five hundred fifty-one and three-tenths feet to corner No. 3, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 3 - 6597 - S B, in mound of stones and earth;

Thence, third course, south sixty-three degrees twenty minutes east six hundred one and seven-tenths feet to corner No. 4, a pine post four inches square, two and one-half feet above ground, marked 2 - 6494 -B S and 4 6597 - S B, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corner No. 2 of said B S. lode claim;

Thence, fourth course, south twenty-two degrees fifteen minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Silver Bell vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the G.N.C. lode claim, at corner No. 1, identical with corner No. 1 of said Silver Bell lode claim;

Thence, first course, south thirty-one degrees fifty-two minutes west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west forty-two feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 2, a pine post four inches square, two feet above ground, marked 4 - 1 - 6494 - S-C P, and 2 - 1 - 6597 - G N C - P L, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corner No. 4 of said Sammon lode claim, corner No. 1 of the Crown Point lode claim Survey No. 6494;

Thence, second course, north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west three hundred five feet to corner No. 3, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 3 - 3 - 6597 - G N C - M, in mound of stones and earth;

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Thence, third course, north thirty-one degrees fifty-two minutes east six hundred feet to corner No. 4, identical with corner No. 2 of said Silver Bell lode claim;

Thence, fourth course, south sixty-three degrees twenty minutes east three hundred five feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending three hundred five feet in length along said G.N.C. vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Mohawk lode claim, at corner No. 1, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 1 - 6597 M, in mound of stones and earth, from which said section corner bears south forty-two degrees east five hundred thirty-eight and four-tenths feet distant;

Thence, first course, south eleven degrees fifteen minutes west eight hundred thirty-two and eight-tenths feet to corner No. 2, identical with corner No. 2 of said Silver Bell lode claim;

Thence, second course, south thirty-one degrees fifty-two minutes west six hundred feet to corner No. 3, identical with corner No. 3 of said G. N. C. lode claim;

Thence, third course, north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west one and five-tenths feet to a point from which discovery bears north thirteen degrees five minutes east four hundred eighty-seven and seven-tenths feet distant; two hundred fifty-six and five-tenths feet to corner No. 4, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 4 - 2 - 6597 - M - M, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corner No. 2 of the Minerva lode claim, Survey No. 6597;

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Thence, fourth course, north five degrees fifty-four minutes east one thousand four hundred ninety-seven and seven-tenths feet to corner No. 5, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 5 - 6597 - M, in mound of stones and earth;

Thence, fifth course, south sixty-three degrees twenty minutes east six hundred twenty and four-tenths feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand four hundred seventy-eight and three-tenths feet in length along said Mohawk vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Promised Land lode claim, at corner No. 1, identical with corner No. 2 of said G. N. C. lode claim, from which said section corner bears north twenty-eight degrees four minutes east one thousand two hundred four and four-tenths feet distant;

Thence, first course, south thirty-one degrees fifty-two minutes west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west two hundred feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 2, a pine post four inches square, two feet above ground, marked 4 - 6494 - C P and 2 - 6597 - P L, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corner No. 4 of said Crown Point lode claim;

Thence, second course, north sixty-three degrees twenty minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 3, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 3 - 6597 - P L, in mound of stones and earth;

Thence, third course, north thirty-one degrees fifty-two minutes east six hundred feet to corner No. 4, a pine post four feet long, four inches square, marked 4 - 7 - 6597 - P L - M P, in mound of stones and earth; identical with corner No. 7 of the Minerva Fraction lode claim, Survey No. 6597;

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Thence, fourth course, south sixty-three degrees twenty minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Promised Land vein or lode; the premises herein granted, containing fifty-six acres and four hundred thirty-seven thousandths of an acre.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said **Tintio Paymaster Mines Company**

the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these presents, and all that portion of the said vein ~~or~~ lode ~~or~~ ledge ~~and~~ of all other veins, lodes, and ledges throughout their entire depth, the tops or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said survey extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes, or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said survey so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes, or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the above-mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby granted shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **Utah** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to its complete development.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, **Calvin Coolidge,**

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
